RALLY REGULATIONS

Section 1 – Rally Novice Class. All exercises are judged on leash and all dogs must enter and leave the ring on a leash. The leash must be made of fabric or leather and needs to be long enough to provide adequate slack.

The **Rally Novice A Class:** *To be eligible for entry in this class, dogs may not have won an AKC Rally Novice (RN) title or any AKC obedience title prior to the close of entries.* A handler must own the dog entered or be a member of the owner's household or immediate family. The handler may not have previously handled any dog that has earned an AKC rally title or any AKC obedience title. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. After a dog earns the Rally Novice (RN) title, it may continue to compete in this class for 60 days. No dog may be entered in both Rally Novice A and Rally Novice B at any one trial.

The **Rally Novice B Class:** Any dog may *be entered* in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced class is earned. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. No dog may be entered in both Rally Novice A and Rally Novice B at any one trial.

Section 2 – Advanced Rally Class. All exercises are judged off leash. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

The Rally Advanced A Class: *To be eligible for this class dogs shall have won the Rally Novice (RN) title but have not won the Rally Advanced (RA) title or any AKC obedience title, prior to the close of entries.* A handler must own the dog entered or be a member of the owner's household or immediate family. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. After a dog earns the Rally Advanced (RA) title, it may continue to compete in this class for 60 days. No dog may be entered in both Rally Advanced A and Rally Advanced B at any one trial.

The Rally Advanced B Class: *To be eligible for entry into this class, competing dogs shall have won the Rally Novice (RN) title prior to close of entries. A dog completing the Rally Advanced (RA) title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely.* The owner or any other person may handle the dog in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. No dog may be entered in both Rally Advanced A and Rally Advanced B at any one trial.

Section 3–Rally Excellent Class. All exercises are judged off leash except the Honor exercise. **Handlers must provide a 6-foot leash when participating in the Honor exercise.** All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

The Rally Excellent A Class: *To be eligible for entry into this class, competing dogs shall have won the Rally Advanced (RA) title, but have not won the Rally Excellent (RE) title or any AKC obedience title, prior to the close of entries.* A handler must own the dog entered or be a member of the owner's household or immediate family. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. After earning the Rally Excellent (RE) title, a dog may continue to compete in this class for 60 days. No dog may be entered in both Rally Excellent A and Rally Excellent B at any one trial.

The Rally Excellent B Class: *To be eligible for entry in this class, competing dogs shall have won the Rally Advanced (RA) title prior to the close of entries.* A dog completing the Rally Excellent (RE) title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. No dog may be entered in both Rally Excellent A and Rally Excellent B at any one trial.

OBEDIENCE AND RALLY ENTRANTS – PLEASE NOTE:

After a dog earns a title, it may be moved up to the next class in a future trial even though the closing date for the trial has passed. This move-up may be requested if, according to the owner's records, the dog has completed the requirements for the title after the closing date of the trial in which the advanced entry is to be made. The request for a move-up must be in writing and presented to the superintendent or trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of each trial. Move-ups may be approved, provided the next level class and judge is available and the class has not reached its limit.

OBEDIENCE AND RALLY ENTRANTS – ATTENTION PLEASE

Please make sure to read the rules about class eligibility before entering.

AMERICAN KENNEL CLUB OBEDIENCE REGULATIONS CHAPTER 3

SECTION 1 NOVICE CLASS A. The Novice A Class shall be for dogs not less than six months of age that have not won the CD title. A handler must own the dog entered, or be a member of the owner's household or immediate family and may not have previously handled any other dog that has earned an AKC Novice, Open or Utility title. A person may enter more than one dog in this class but the same person who handled each dog in the first five exercises must handle each dog in the Long Sit and Long Down exercises. However, if a person has handled more than one dog in the first four exercises, he/she must have an additional handler for each additional dog, when more than one dog is judged in the same group for the Long Sit and Long Down. No dog may be entered in both Novice A and Novice B at any one trial.

SECTION 2 NOVICE CLASS B. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class to earn a CD title. A person may handle more than one dog in this class, but each dog must have separate handler for the Long Sit and Long Down exercises when judged in the same group. No dog may be entered in both Novice A and Novice B classes at any one trial.

AMERICAN KENNEL CLUB OBEDIENCE REGULATIONS CHAPTER 4

SECTION 1 OPEN CLASS A. The Open A Class shall be for dogs that have won the CD title but have not won the CDX title. Anyone who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned an OTCH may not enter or handle dogs in this class. Each dog must be handled by its owner or by a member of the owner's household or immediate family. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person shall handle the dog in the group exercises as in the first five exercises; however, he/she must have an additional handler for each additional dog, when more than one dog is judged in the same group for Long Sit and Long Down. No dog may be entered in both the Open A and Open B classes at any one trial.

SECTION 2 OPEN CLASS B. The Open B class will be for dogs that have won the CD or CDX titles. A dog may continue to compete in this class after it has won the UD title. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class but the same person who handled each dog in the first five exercises must handle each dog in the Long Sit and Long Down exercises. However, if a person has handled more than one dog in the first five exercises, he/she must provide an additional handler for each additional dog, when more than one dog is judged in the same group for the Long Sit and Long Down. No dog may be entered in both Open A and Open B classes at any one trial.

AMERICAN KENNEL CLUB OBEDIENCE REGULATIONS CHAPTER 5

SECTION 1 UTILITY CLASS A. The Utility A class shall be for those dogs that have won the CDX title, but have not won the UD title. Anyone who has trained or exhibited a dog that has won an OTCH may not enter or handle dogs in this class. Each dog must be handled by its owner or by a member of the owner's immediate family or household. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class.

SECTION 2 UTILITY CLASS B. The Utility B class shall be for dogs that have won the CDX or UD title. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class and owners may enter more than one dog in this class. No dog may be entered in both Utility A and Utility B classes at any one trial.

REGULAR OBEDIENCE CLASSES: NOVICE CLASS A / B * OPEN CLASS A / B * UTILITY CLASS A / B

REGULAR RALLY CLASSES: RALLY NOVICE A / B * RALLY ADVANCED A / B * RALLY EXCELLENT A / B

OBEDIENCE ENTRY FEES: \$25.00 for first Regular Obedience entry, \$18.00 for second obedience entry of same dog same day. **PLEASE NOTE:** (Saturday & Sunday are separate events and do not count towards 2nd entry for same dog for next days entry) (Rally Event is separate for entry fees) Per Rules Applying to Dog Shows, Chapter 11, Section 2, recording fees are \$.50 per first entry of each dog and Event Service Fees are \$3.00 per entry (not per dog)

RALLY ENTRY FEES: \$25.00 for first Rally entry, \$18.00 for second Rally entry of same dog same day. **PLEASE NOTE:** (Saturday & Sunday are separate events and do not count towards 2nd entry for same dog for next days entry) (Obedience Event is separate for entry fees) Per Rally Regulations, Chapter 1, Section 5, recording fees are \$3.00 per entry (not per dog)

NOTE: Rottweiler entries will be counted first with all breed following. Entries will close when the numerical limit or limits have been reached even if closing date has not been reached. No entry(s) shall be added after the closing time and date specified in the premium list.

NOTE: *Entries sent overnight or by any carrier which will require signature upon its delivery will be declined unless waivers are signed off (you must request mail to be delivered without requirement for signature).*

CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES IS: 8:00PM Wednesday, 13 May 2009, after which time entries cannot be accepted, canceled or changed, except as provided for in chapter 11 Section 6 of the Dog Show Rules. The Program of Judging will be mailed to each entrant prior to the show. This can be done electronically for those who provide email information on entry forms.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Entries in one or more specified classes will automatically close when certain limits have been reached, even if this occurs before the official closing date.

Policy re: NSF Checks for RCA Specialty Entries: Offender must make good on NSF check and pay all outstanding fees and charges incurred by Club resulting from NSF Check. Additional restrictions may result on future entries for the offender.

ENTRY FEES will not be refunded in the event of errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date, nor if the dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge or barred from competition by the Event Committee or because it has been entered incorrectly. If because of riots, civil disturbances, weather or other acts beyond the control of the management, it is impossible to open or to complete the show, no refund of entries will be made.

IF A DOG IS ENTERED in more than one class, the highest priced class shall be considered the first entry. The show giving club may decline any entries for cause or indebtedness to the club over thirty days past due. The club may refuse to receive or may remove any dog from the show premises due to disease, viciousness or other causes, and no one shall have any claim or recourse against the club or any official thereof for such action.

NO ENTRY shall be accepted which specifies any condition as to its acceptance, this includes post dated checks or requesting checks to be held until a certain date.

To be acceptable an entry must be submitted with the required entry fee on an official AKC entry form. DOGS entered in a wrong class may not be transferred to another class. **HANDLERS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR MAKING SURE THEIR DOGS ARE ENTERED IN THE CORRECT CLASS.** Any change request must be received in writing prior to the closing date and time. RCA will refund 50% of entry fee to entrants whose bitch comes in season after entries have closed. Refund may be obtained by sending a written statement to trial secretary. The Trial Secretary must receive written notification a minimum of 30 minutes prior to start of judging. Email is acceptable.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ENTERING DOGS

Select the classes for which your dog is eligible, then fill out the entry completely. Please TYPE or PRINT **clearly**, the Club assumes no liability for wrong information.

PLEASE remember to include only AKC Titles, OFA and CERF numbers

(other titles/certificates are not printed in AKC catalogs)

Please help us make sure your entries are correct which may include OFA and CERF numbers and which will be listed in the show catalog. The complete numbers should be written on the entry form following the name of the dog. If not using the attached entry form, please make sure you are using the most current one available on AKC through downloading.

EVENT RULES

ALL DOGS shall be held on leash except when in the Obedience Ring. There shall be no drilling nor intensive or corrective training of dogs on the show grounds or premises. The use of corrective devices is strictly prohibited on the show grounds. Exhibitors must be governed by any rules or regulations of civil authorities or building/ parking regulations.

EXHIBITORS and HANDLERS will be held responsible for clean conditions in and around their crates and for cleaning up after their dogs.

DOGS SHOULD BE PRESENT in ample time before their scheduled judging time and they may be removed as soon as they are no longer needed for competition. Once brought into the grounds, a dog entered in this show may not be withheld from competition unless excused by a Judge, Veterinarian or the Event Committee.

JUDGES WILL NOT WAIT for any dog holding up a class. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have his dog ready to be shown and at the entrance to the judging ring when the class is scheduled to be judged. Owners or handlers of the dog are solely responsible for the presence of their dogs in the judging rings. It is not the responsibility of the ring steward to locate any dog, its owner or handler when the dog's presence is needed in the show ring. Only dogs entered at this show are allowed on show grounds.

THE MANAGEMENT will exercise every precaution for the safety of the dogs exhibited and it is understood that neither the club nor the management nor the landlord will be responsible for the loss of, damage to, or any other damage caused by any dog for any cause.

THE EVENT COMMITTEE will use due diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of an accident or misfortune, to either dogs or exhibitors participating in the show.

THE WELFARE OF AN EXHIBITOR'S CHILD is the responsibility of the exhibitor, who must exercise control and restraint over the child while the child is on the show premises. Failure to do so will result in action by the Event Committee.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

Rottweiler Club of Alaska does not agree to arbitrate claims as set forth on the official AKC entry form for this event.

AN EXERCISE AREA will be provided outside. It is the responsibility of the exhibitors to take care of their dogs and to clean any area soiled by their dogs.

RIBBON PRIZES

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING: According to AKC Obedience Regulations the following applies:

OBEDIENCE & RALLY TRIAL PRIZES

RIBBONS & TROPHIES WILL BE PRESENTED IN THE RING. Special prizes/trophies will be presented on Saturday and Sunday following the last regular class. It is the responsibility of the handler of each dog to claim any and all trophies. No trophies will be mailed. The Club is not responsible for lost or broken trophies after presentation. All trophies not used or claimed at the Trial become the property of the Club, to be used at future trials in the donor's name.

Some special trophies may be donated based on official AKC titles. Special trophies may be offered for Junior Handlers.

Directions to Chugiak Benefit Association

From the Glenn Highway (Alaska Hwy 1) (highway "runs" North-South; mountains are generally "east")

North Birchwood exit: go east on N. Birchwood Loop Rd. to Old Glenn Hwy, turn right and go south 1.0 miles to the ballfield (on the right)

South Birchwood exit: go east on S. Birchwood Loop Rd. to Old Glenn Hwy, turn left and go north 2.1 miles to the ballfield (on the left)

North Eagle River exit: go east on access/overpass road to Old Glenn Hwy, turn left and go north 4.4 miles to the ballfield (on the left)
